HONOUR FOR HUSBAND OF KESWICK LADY

Carmelo Lison Tolosana, the husband of Julia, the daughter of Commander and Mrs. William Donald, Church Street, Keswick, has been elected a member of the exclusive and prestigious Royal Academy of Moral Sciences and Politics at Madrid.

Among the three hundred or so invited guests at the ceremony were Julia's uncle, Jock du Boulay of Threlkeld, and his wife Ann.

Julia's husband has the chair of anthropology at Madrid University and he becomes one of only 36 members of the Academy, which is mainly made up of Ministers of the Government and members of the University.

The couple, who met at Oxford and married in 1962, travel the world extensively as Carmelo is in demand as a lecture and authority in his field. He has recently lectured in Japan and South America, and his wife, who regularly returns to Keswick to visit her parents, is a fluent Spanish speaker.

Mrs. du Boulay said: "It was a long and impressive ceremony and it was a wonderful privilege to be one of those invited to attend. The Academy building where it took place is one of the oldest buildings in Madrid."

Having received his election to the Academy, Carmelo is now entitled to be known by the grand title of "Excellency".

TILL THEFT

A Canadian who came to work in Keswick has been jailed 15 months after being found of stealing over £21,000 from Caterite's Lakes Food Store, Tithebarn Street, Keswick.

David Wilkin, who gave his address as Southey Street, Keswick, was asked for a further 29 offences considered.

Carlisle Crown Court heard that Wilkins worked for Caterite's Food Stores as the custom services manager when the new store opened in Tithebarn Street in the Spring of last year. The police called in the Autumn after they discovered discrepancies in the surveillance films showed Wilkin pocketing the money.

Wilkin admitted tampering with the tills and taking cash from the cash room. Just over £10,000 of the cash had been recovered at his home.

Judge Anthony Edmonds sentenced him to 15 months in prison on each of five offences, to run concurrently.

DE LUXE ACCOMMODATION GRADING

The national tourist board for England, Scotland and Wales has for the first time, set up a common standardised structure for Quality Assurance schemes. This means the visitor can book accommodation with confidence anywhere in Britain.

Each tourist board has adopted the same criteria and grading while adding a new top quality grade to the existing Approved, Commended and Recommended grades. The new Crown Classifications will remain unchanged.

De Luxe has been chosen as the top standard after a study involving both consumers and the industry will apply to top quality guest houses, inns, bed and breakfast and self-catering establishments nationwide.

"The new grading scheme is the introduction of the fourth standard, which will be a fairer reflection of the standards achieved in the industry," said Bobbie Nunn, Senior Accommodation Officer at the Cumberland Tourist Board. "It will give the public a clearer indication of the quality of accommodation they expect to find here."

Combined with Crown Classifications, which indicate the quality of accommodation, the new scheme provides visitors with comprehensive information to help them choose their accommodation.
